Prayer Requests: to be able to successfully live out desire to serve God, reach out to others and help others during this time; raise necessary support money; continued encouragement from church family

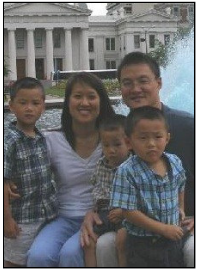

We [5 Christians from different fellowships from Cornell] will be supporting the missionaries and the staff at the hospital. Through this, we hope that

God will give us the boldness to build relationships with the patients and staff and will give us His love to share with them. We will also be working with the children in the hospital. Many of these children are from poor families and they are constantly surrounded by poverty and sickness. We will be sharing messages of God's love through storytelling, arts and crafts, games, and other activities. We will also have opportunities to work with the children at the pre-school and children with World Relief's Child Survival Project. It is our prayer that each of these children will receive the hope of knowing that there is a Father Who loves them and Who cares so deeply about them.

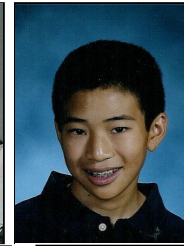

Prayer Requests: adjusting to new environment; overcoming shy nature to share faith with confidence

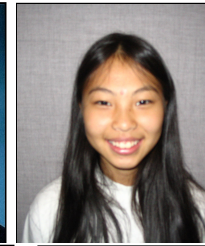

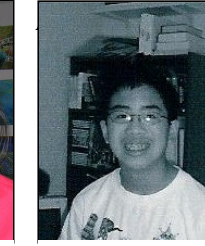

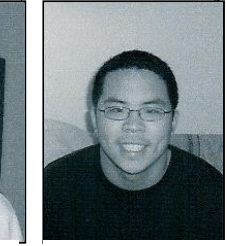

[Letter from pastor in Mon Valley. The CLF served in this same area 3 years ago – what a witness!]

Hello!

I am John Custer, the pastor of the Orchard Christian Fellowship in Monessen, Pennsylvania. I may have met you when you were here on a YouthWorks mission trip. I want to let you know about all the great things that have been happening in this community as a result of your visit to the Mon Valley.

- With help from YouthWorks, our church purchased the former Epiphany School and renamed it the "Schooner Youth Center."
- The Monessen Communities That Care (CTC) after school program and an after school sports mentoring program conducted by Christian Sports International are operating four days a week at the Schooner Youth Center.
- Norman Madison's Youth Gym has acquired lots of equipment and is almost ready to open.
- YouthWorks interns are setting up a Soup Kitchen which will benefit local college students. Fifty local persons showed up for food during a recent experimental supper and 110 were fed at a Salvation Army dinner held there.
- Volunteers established relationships with people in the community. This past summer our church received the highest number of calls for YouthWorks assistance we have ever taken. Residents ask when "the kids" are coming. YouthWorks volunteers helped serve meals daily at a community building in a housing project and played kickball with the children.
- Over 30 homes have been painted.
- A new relationship with the city was forged when the volunteers painted street curbs for the city of Monessen.
- A number of local children came to faith in Christ through the YouthWorks volunteers.
- Several summers ago, YouthWorks volunteers performed an almost incredible feat in helping clean up a badly deteriorated house for a needy man. The township officers were faced with having to condemn and seize the property. The neighbors said that "the Christians" came and cleaned it up. The man has retained his family inheritance to this day.
- Tasks around our own church which never get done (sorting clothing for distribution to the poor, moving construction materials, cleaning and ordering storage areas) were completed by the hands of many. What a lift for us!

As it was said of Jesus, the whole world would be filled with books in order to recount all that He did. Almost the same could be said of the many fine volunteers who have come to our city through YouthWorks over the past summers. Your efforts have advanced the testimony of Christ in our community beyond what any of the local churches have been able to do. I personally want to invite you back to serve alongside us this upcoming summer. Your help has been practical, effective and even crucial. I look forward to seeing you again soon!
